WHAT IS THE WEST?

- thing-in-the-world (what is Western)
- conceptual equipment (civilizational analysis)
- rhetorical commonplace (civilizational identity)

LEGITIMATION

- public rhetorical strategy
- rendering courses of action acceptable
- foreclosing other options
 - contingent -> necessary
- identity key: who are we?

COMMUNITY

- a form of relation between actors
 - surrounds and binds actors
 - "nesting"
 - can be an actor in itself...
- terms of engagement are central

TWOVIEWS

- economists:
 - individuals first, social relations second
 - need to explain coordinated individual acts
- sociologists:
 - social relations first, actors second
 - need to explain living tradition and its use(s)

THREE SOCIOLOGICAL STEPS

- rhetorical topography
 - "textual ethnography"
- specific history / genealogy
 - past deployments produce conditions of possibility
- deployment in concrete debates about action(s)

STATE OF THE UNION

- American exceptionalism
 - keep America pure
 - enemies are "evil"
- pro-democracy universal crusade...
 - ...but as tactic for securing America's vision
 - ...and doing so unilaterally

IMPLICATIONS

- coalitions of the willing
- decline of multilateral forums / alliances
- contingent global commitments
- no West in evidence...
- ...which is a bad thing
